OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Isaiah 43:8-13

The lesson from Isaiah reminds us of the role that first hand eye witnesses played in the formulation of St. Luke's Gospel.

⁸Lead out those who have eyes but are blind, who have ears but are deaf.

⁹All the nations gather together and the peoples assemble. Which of them foretold this and proclaimed to us the former things?

Let them bring in their witnesses to prove they were right, so that others may hear and say, "It is true."

¹⁰"You are my witnesses," declares the LORD, "and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he.

Before me no god was formed, nor will there be one after me.

¹¹I, even I, am the LORD, and apart from me there is no savior.

¹²I have revealed and saved and proclaimed — I, and not some foreign god among you.

You are my witnesses," declares the LORD, "that I am God. ¹³Yes, and from ancient days I am he. No one can deliver out of my hand.

⁵But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.

⁶For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time has come for my departure. ⁷I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. ⁸Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day — and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing.

GOSPEL

St. Luke 1:1-4; 24:44-53

Luke lays out his motivation and methodology in assembling a gospel that is an “orderly account” of eyewitness testimony.

¹Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, ²just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. ³Therefore, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, it seemed good also to me to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, ⁴so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught.

⁴⁴He said to them, “This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written

about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms.”

⁴⁵Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶He told them, “This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷and repentance and the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.”

⁵⁰When he had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. ⁵¹While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven. ⁵²Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. ⁵³And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God.

Witness – the Living of a Gospel Centered-Life

After the sermon, the congregation stands to confess:

NICENE CREED

(Public confession is faith's response to God's saving Word. Christians composed the Nicene Creed in the fourth century to defend the Bible's teachings that both Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit are true God, equal to the Father in one eternal, undivided Trinity.)

OFFERTORY *(a musical piece played during the gathering of the offering)* **& OFFERING PRAYER**

During the Covid crisis our preference is to gather our offerings electronically or through the mail but for those who do choose to bring offerings with them to worship there is a large offering basket at the main worship area doors for you to drop in your offerings later as you are dismissed from worship.

If you are not a member of Faith, we do not want you to feel obligated to participate in the offering. (God desires cheerful givers - not gifts based on a sense of guilt or obligation.) We gather our offerings during worship, because the Bible teaches that giving is *an act of worship*. Most of our church and school ministry is carried out by what is given in weekly worship offerings. May the Lord bless you, and may he use every one of our offerings to him as a blessing to many others.
