think or say those words often. "Oh, the lawn looks good enough. I'll wait another couple days to mow." "Oh, the house isn't really *that* dirty. It is good enough for now." "My job's done well enough for today. I'm heading home!"

What about when it is quitting time here in this life? Are we sure that we are going home to heaven? Are we now or have we ever been good enough?

We might be individuals who settle for good enough more than we would like to admit. However, we have a God who doesn't settle for anything but perfection. Jesus says, "Be perfect . . . as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48).

As things have slowly been moving back to "normal" from COVID our Faith family has journeyed together through the suspension of our school ministry operations at the beginning of July. With the retirement of Pastor Hermanson later in July our tsunami of staffing transitions left us with only three existing staff members while we extended Calls for new candidates to join our staff.

In mid-October the installation of Staff Minister of Music & Instruction Joshua Kramer greatly helped our worship ministry and instructional efforts move back into more fa-

A FESTIVAL OF NINE LESSONS & CAROLS Saturday 12/17 & Sunday 12/18

Each Christmas Eve, millions around the world tune their radios to hear a truly glorious service: The Festival of Nine Lessons & Carols from King's College, Cambridge, England. As one of the great traditions of the Christmas season Lessons and Carols is also sung by church choirs large and small in every part of the English-speaking world. Faith, Antioch will once again host a Lessons & Carols service this year.

A Service of Lessons and Carols has been an annual tradition at King's since 1918. But its roots go back even further to the 1880s. Beginning with *Once in Royal David's City*, sixteen boy and fourteen undergraduate male voices sing carols old and new. Lectors read nine Scripture lessons tracing the history of God's plan of salvation in Christ Jesus. Since 1928, the service has been broadcast worldwide to millions of listeners every year, even during World War II when the stained glass (and heating system) was removed from the cathedral for safety reasons. Since its inception, the lessons and prayers have remained virtually unchanged.

As the creator of the Lessons and Carols service pointed out in the first program, the pattern and strength of the service resides with the lessons themselves and not with the music. "The main theme of the service is the development, through the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, of the loving purpose of God in sending his Son. Carols and hymns simply guide us in our response to the word of God's promise."

Faith, Antioch has now held these holiday services for more than two decades, becoming a yearly favorite for both congregation & our friends in the community. If you have never experienced a presentation of the Christmas message in this format, you've truly missed out!

Your friends at Faith cordially invite you to join us for this special event. We also encourage you to let your friends know! Identical services will be held the weekend before Christmas on Saturday evening, December 17, at 5:30 PM and Sunday morning, December 18, at 9:30 AM.

Manger Scenes

Has the word "crèche" caught your ear at Christmas time? It's an occasionally used term for a scene of figurines and a small stable depicting the first Christmas night. Creches often grace our homes, our yards or sit under our Christmas trees. "Creche" is simply the old French word for "crib" or "nursery" used in reference of the manger or stable.

St. Francis of Assisi is most often credited by historians for assembling the very first crèche around AD 1200 to express his love for the Christ Child. But he also clearly expressed his love for the animals he nurtured and protected. In his early annual scenes St. Francis depicted the Child alone with the animals snuggling him to keep him warm. Later on he added Mary, Joseph, shepherds, angels and even Magi to illustrate and teach the Christmas Gospels for all who could not read them for themselves.

Today an ornate crèche may be a family's or congregation's truly treasured heirloom. It has also grown increasingly popular in recent years to produce living nativities and provide observers the opportunity to experience the sights, sounds, and even the smells of that first Christmas night in little Bethlehem when there was no room in the inn.

Hopefully such displays are enjoyed as originally intended by Francis as an opportunity to express love and worship of the heavenly Child laid in a manger. And now you know how it all started!
